



AT A GLANCE

THE HEART of Global Tribe is reflected in our creed: To safeguard the helpless and do them no wrong; to show courage on behalf of those who cannot defend themselves. **THE WORK** of Global Tribe is to mobilize resources and partner with existing ministries, grass roots leaders, to make poverty history; to provide a platform for their work, recruit volunteers for their mission, and raise funds to help with their expenses— to expend our collective energy and resources to combat physical and spiritual hunger, both around the globe and at home. Here is a glimpse of our work. Global Tribe is to focus our resources on those with whom we partner.



BAJA MEXICO. In partnership with Baja Christian Ministries, we help them with funds and volunteers to build homes, classrooms, medical facilities, and provide relief. From the time we began assistance, homebuilding has jumped dramatically to 250 a year, assisted largely by the Newsboys platform. In 2007 we introduced Purple Book, designed to teach basic bible principles to new believers. Current numbers indicate 32,000 have engaged the study with 12,000 graduated from 800 groups. They now have 5 staff who are regional Purple Book directors. 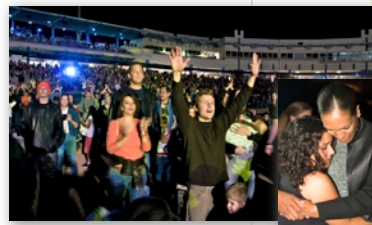
BAWANA, INDIA. The Global Tribe Children’s Center in Bawana is operated by Julie-Ann “Jig” Clayton. Her passion is reaching the kids in the slums of India, providing a caring center for education, renewal, and hope. From children’s activities to the arts, general education, solid meals, and the opportunity to build solid relationships with families, the global Tribe Children’s Center is a place for mentoring and love, wrapped in the Gospel.

Many Indian children suffer from poverty; more than 50% of India's total population lives below the poverty line, and more than 40% of this population are children. There are 160 million family units.

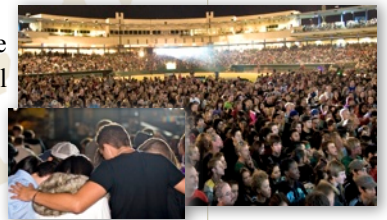


ZAMBIA, AFRICA AND THE AMAZON. Overland Missions is led by Phil Smithurst, who we affectionately call “The Indiana Jones of Missions.” Phil earned this title. He was in Special Forces in the South African Army during the Angola War, was a champion Land Rover racer, and is an all around adventurer – so who else would God call to this mission? The folks at Overland take the Great Commission – to the uttermost regions – quite seriously, and Phil teaches his recruits a fearless passion for

taking the Gospel where others simply do not go. Each team is trained in survival, first aid, truck repair, and all the skills most missionaries would rarely need. Anthony Walton – Global Tribe Founder – gets regular emails from his daughter Rebecca who is serving in Zambia with Overland. Whether from their base at Victoria Falls in Zambia or in the Amazon, they are going, blazing trails and proclaiming Christ! The vast majority of Zambia's 11 million people still live in abject poverty



REACH EVENTS ACROSS THE U.S. Using the platform of a FREE Newsboys concert, we partner with a key local radio station, local churches and businesses, and a local food pantry to conduct an evangelistic event called REACH. Preceding each event, we visit with radio who hosts a meeting of pastors and another for businessmen. There we cast the vision, and encourage the churches to provide volunteers for the prayer



team, and leadership for the assimilation team to make sure responders are connected to a church. We encourage Christians to bring neighbors, coworkers, friends, classmates, or anyone needing to hear the Gospel in an entertaining environment. Since fall 2008, we have done 3 events – Tucson AZ, Johnson City TN, and Saginaw MI. Collectively we saw 24,000 attend, 800 make decisions for Christ, 9 tons of food collected, 75 churches come together to impact the community, and 3 radio stations who were passionate about the Gospel!



REACH PROTOTYPE: CHINA WAS A GLOBAL TRIBE AND NEWSBOYS FOCUS IN 2006

China is a country with about 100 million students. Newsboys traveled to China for a series of free and low-cost events, foreshadowing REACH events in the U.S. They were not prepared for what developed as a result of those nights. The audience consisted primarily of university students who came either out of curiosity or a hunger for western rock. It was apparent to all that the

student's hearts were touched by the message and the music and the genuine love and commitment shown by the band. Many people serving God in those Chinese cities as teachers, planters, and mission workers communicated the overwhelming response to the message and the increased opportunity to share the Gospel with their student friends. Many students came to Christ. Today, the impact Global Tribe and newsboys had on these students for just one night in their lives is still felt in these communities where the Christian population is growing steadily. 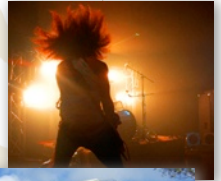
ZEAL – WELLINGTON/ WAITAKERE NZ– GLOBAL TRIBE'S YOUTH VENUES.

In 1995

Global Tribe founder Anthony Walton had a vision for a youth venue, designed specifically as a facility to

inspire creativity and provide a platform to share the Gospel socially – friendship evangelism. “Zeal is all about a chance to be creative, whether it's jamming some music with your mates, performing your solo tunes, showing your first art exhibition, designing or painting a masterpiece, or being entertained by a great night of rock, hip hop, acoustic shows and much more.” Global Tribe has two Zeal locations – Wellington and Waitakere.

The Wellington Zeal venue overlooks Glover Park in the Wellington CBD, and sees over 200 young people every week through its various programs and events. The venue is an intimate setting that can stand 250 people, with a stage that has held many well known, as well as up-in-coming New Zealand artists. There is an upstairs mezzanine floor that over looks the rest of the venue, with couches to lax out in, and a media room with 5 computers running broadband. It houses a main stage with a 500 seating capacity, Acoustic / DJ



stage, Rehearsal rooms, Recording Studio, a Global Café, Art studio, Art Gallery Wall, and Media room.



STOP CHILD TRAFFICKING NOW!

Most recently we have developed a relationship with Stop Child Trafficking (SCTNow). They studied many organizations and their methods used in addressing child trafficking. Almost every organization they encountered is focused on rescuing victims. While they support all worthy endeavors in this cause, research indicates funding efforts to support the deterrence and eliminate the demand fueling this heinous crime is most effective. To that end, Stop Child Trafficking has chosen to fund a bold, new approach, one that addresses the demand side of child sex trafficking by targeting buyers/predators for prosecution and conviction. Until the demand side is addressed, the supply will always exist. Few people know that virtually no convictions have occurred in the U.S. in the last 10 years, thus this heinous crime grows - 600,000 – 800,000 people are bought and sold across international borders each year; 50% are children, most are female. The majority of these victims are forced into the commercial sex trade. – (U.S. Department of State, 2004, Trafficking in Persons Report, Washington, D.C.) SCTNow has launched a national campaign to raise money for retired elite military operatives targeting the demand side of trafficking. These Special Operative Teams gather information on child predators both in the U.S. and abroad, information that will be used to convict child sex buyers. These operatives use the skills developed in the War on Terror in this war to bring down predators. The FBI, International Justice Mission, and local law enforcement agencies have vetted this strategy and are eager to work with these operative teams once funding is secured.
